Arrival in New Zealand

Please arrive in the week beginning 19 January 2015. This will allow time for you to recover from your trip, settle into your homestay and have your interview with the Director of International Students before the Orientation Programme on 27 and 28 January.

A representative of the school will meet students at Auckland International Airport and bring them to Tauranga. The trip from Auckland to Tauranga will be by shuttle or car. The \$200 cost is included in the fees invoice. Please notify the school as soon as your travel plans have been finalized.

International Students' Orientation Programme

It is essential that all new students attend this programme to ensure that they can be organized and have some understanding of the school before term begins. Language testing and subject selection is also done at this time, and it is a time during which students can get to know other students at the school.



Summary Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students

When students from other countries come to study in New Zealand, it is important that those students are well informed, safe, and properly cared for.

New Zealand educational providers have an important responsibility for international students' welfare.

This summary provides an overview of the "Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students" (the Code), and provides a procedure that students can follow if they have concerns about their treatment by a New Zealand educational provider or agent of a provider.

What is the Code?

The Code is a document that provides a framework for service delivery by educational providers and their agents to international students. The Code sets out the minimum standards of advice and care that are expected of educational providers with respect to international students. The Code applies to pastoral care and provision of information only, and not to academic standards.

Who does the Code apply to?

The Code applies to all education providers in New Zealand with international students enrolled. The Code is mandatory to these providers and must be signed by them.

How can I get a copy of the Code?

You can download a copy of the Code from the Ministry of Education website at www.minedu.govt.nz/educationSectors/InternationalEducation/

How do I know if an education provider has signed the Code?

The New Zealand Ministry of Education maintains a register of all signatories to the Code. This is available online from www.minedu.govt.nz/educationSectors/InternationalEducation/. If the education provider that you are seeking to enrol with is not a signatory to the Code, you will not be granted a permit from Immigration New Zealand and you will not be able to study at that institution.

A summary of the Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students

The Code sets standards for education providers to ensure that:

- high professional standards are maintained
- the recruitment of international students is undertaken in an ethical and responsible manner
- information supplied to international students is comprehensive, accurate, and up-to-date
- students are provided with information prior to entering into any commitments
- contractual dealings with international students are conducted in an ethical and responsible manner
- the particular needs of international students are recognised
- international students are in safe accommodation

• all providers have fair and equitable internal procedures for the resolution of international student grievances.

Full details of what is covered can be found in the Code itself.

The Code also establishes the IEAA and the Review Panel to receive and adjudicate on student complaints.

Optional Tourist Fee:

To be held in trust for optional Tours and Tourist Activities operated by outside professional tour companies eg Coromandel, Hot Water Beach, Bay of Islands, Waitomo Caves, White Island (this will not be sufficient to cover major North or South Island tours) \$2000 per year; \$1000 per half year or less.

Tuition Fees include:

- Normal school tuition.
- Government imposed levy.
- Textbooks (on loan).
- Director of International Students and Homestay Co-ordinator, who will help with any problems the student may have.
- Pastoral care and career guidance.
- Goods and Services Tax.
- Orientation programme.
- Use of all school facilities, including access to computer (including Internet and e-mail) facilities.

Additional School Expenses:

These vary according to the individual programme chosen by the student. They will be deducted from the student's Activity Fee, and a statement showing these deductions will be available to parents at any time upon request.

Refund of Fees:

International student fees are accounted for separately and funds are held in reserve to meet any refunds required.

If a student decides against coming to New Zealand, the tuition fees, minus an administration fee of \$500, will be refunded.

Once a student has arrived in New Zealand, refunds will be made only in the most exceptional circumstances (e.g. if return home is necessary because of serious illness or death of a close family member), and then only partial refunds may be made, as the school will have incurred costs on the student's behalf for the whole of the year.

If the status of the student's visa changes during the year and permanent residency is obtained, there is no refund of tuition fees.

The Board of Trustees will make no refund to a student who is expelled from the school.

Enrolment is provisional and is subject to the applicant meeting English language level entry requirements for studying at Tauranga Girls' College. Tauranga Girls' College expects that students have a level of English language ability which will enable them to take part in the school curriculum (level 3 – 4 on the International English Standards' Scale).

Information about Activities

At Tauranga Girls' College, we want you to gain a sense of New Zealand culture and society, as well as getting a first class academic education.

At no cost to the student are events such as:

- A welcome Barbeque with homestays and staff at the beginning of the year
- An orientation bus tour of the area with kiwi "buddies"
- A mid-winter Christmas celebration with homestay families

<u>Included in your activity fee</u>, in addition to uniform, stationery and subject fees, are the following events. (NB there may be some small changes according to availability of events)

- Cultural trip to Rotorua: see boiling mud pools, geysers, experience a Maori welcome and feast (called a "hangi") and cultural performance
- Weekend trip to Wellington or another New Zealand city, or a day trip to Auckland, including sightseeing and, where possible, a rugby match including our famous All Black rugby team
- Trips to other centres to celebrate cultural festival days as available: Chinese New Year, Japan Day, etc.
- One social event per term with our brother school: Tauranga Boys' College. These may be dinners, sports events (volleyball, ten pin bowling) or simple social gathering and games at either school.
- One day ski trip, weather permitting.

This list may be added to as opportunities arise, and suggestions are always warmly welcomed.

Year 12 Outdoor Education Camp

The Year 12 Physical Education class has a weeklong Outdoor Education camp at the Outdoor Pursuits Centre on the slopes of Mt Tongariro. All students doing this course are expected to go on this camp. If there are additional places available, international students may have the opportunity to do this. The cost is \$350 - \$400, which may be taken from the activity fee. Please look at extra documents (OPC) and complete if interested. Please return this with the application form.

For those here at the end of the year, and not taking part in external examinations, an activity programme is included.

There is no extra charge for this. The programme varies each year according to student requests, but may include:

- A day trip to Hobbiton
- Jet-boating
- Further adventure in Rotorua: luge, sheep show, kiwi watching, geo-thermal activity
- Horse riding
- Visit to gold mine and environs
- Day trip to Auckland: zoo, sky tower, Kelly Tarlton's aquarium.
- Kiwifruit farm
- Kayaking/water activities

Please note that any money remaining at the end of the student's time at school is refunded to the parents, or parents may request that this is given to their daughter before she returns to her home country.

Optional Trips: Tours and Tourism

There are many trips available, run by professional and experienced tour groups who are licensed to undertake such activities. While you are with us, you may like to do some of these trips, we are happy to help you to book and pay for these from your Trust Account. Following please find examples of such trips and some tour companies we book with. We suggest you look at these and discuss them with parents before you travel. (Please note: your Optional Trip fee will not cover the big North and South Island Tours.

Parental Permission for Extreme Activities

Fees Refund Conditions for International Students

School Fees

- 1. If you withdraw from your course of study **before** the course completion date, you may be eligible for a refund of school fees.
- 2. Any application for refund of fees must be made in writing. You must write to the Board of Trustees explaining why you have withdrawn from the course and your reasons for seeking a refund.
- 3. If your application is made before the start of your course, your fees will be refunded in full, less an administration fee of \$500 to cover costs incurred by the school.
- 4. If your application is made after the start of your course, you will not receive a refund, except in exceptional circumstances, (e.g. return home is necessary because of serious illness or death of a close family member) and then only partial refunds may be made as the school will have incurred costs on the student's behalf for the whole of the year.
- 5. If fees have been paid in full and a visa is not granted in time for the student to attend the beginning of her course, then the start date may be extended with no financial penalty incurred.
- 6. If the status of the student's visa changes during the year and permanent residence is obtained, there is no refund of tuition fees.
- 7. The Board of Trustees will make no refund to a student who is expelled from the school.


Homestay Fees (based on all homestay fees paid in advance)

- 1. If you move out of your homestay before the end of your contract, the portion of your homestay fees not already used will be returned to you. The Homestay Placement Fee of \$300 cannot be refunded.
- 2. To have your homestay fees returned, you must write to the Board of Trustees giving two weeks' notice, or pay two weeks fees in lieu of notice.
- 3. If you cancel your homestay contract before you move into the homestay, your fees will be refunded in full, less a Homestay Placement Fee of \$300.

4: Tuition Agreement

Please take a copy of this for your records.

If Tauranga Girls' College ("School") accepts the student named in the application for tuition ("Student") for tuition in New Zealand, the following terms and conditions shall apply:

- 1. The School shall provide tuition in accordance with the New Zealand Ministry of Education Code of Practice for the recruitment, welfare and support of international students.
- 2. The School shall arrange homestay in accordance with the homestay agreement. All students are required to live in homestays arranged by the school unless they are living with a parent or a guardian appointed by the parents. Homestay rates are stated in the fee schedule.
- 3. Students are accepted for enrolment at Tauranga Girls' College, subject to the condition that their English Language proficiency meets the required standards. The school reserves the right to alter courses or year levels as it sees fit, once the student has been tested upon arrival. Students without an adequate level of English may be directed to attend an alternative institution to study a suitable English language programme first. This will incur a further tuition fee to the institution providing the English Language tuition.
- 4. The parents or guardians of the Student who have signed the application for tuition on behalf of the Student ("Parents") irrevocably appoint and authorise the principal of the School (or such other person as may be appointed by the School to carry out the principal's duties) to:
 - 4.1 Receive information from any person, authority or corporate body concerning the Student including, but not limited to, medical, educational or welfare information;
 - 4.2 Provide consents in respect of any activity carried out and authorised by the School;
 - 4.3 Receive financial information relating to the Student including bank accounts, debts or income of the Student while in New Zealand;
 - 4.4 Provide consents that may be necessary to be given on the Student's behalf in the event of a medical emergency where it is not reasonably practicable to contact the Parents.
- 5. The Parents agree to provide the school, and be transparent with, academic, medical or other information relating to the well-being of the Student as may be requested from time to time by the School or that has relevance to her stay in New Zealand. This relevance is at the discretion of the School. These matters may include behavioural, social and medical information relating to the Student. Failure to disclose any relevant matters may result in the Student being returned to her home country and/or any extra costs incurred to be that of the Parents. This will be at the discretion of the School.
- 6. The Parents irrevocably authorise the principal of the School to advise the Student's homestay hosts of all matters and information required to be provided to parents of any student under the

Education Act 1989 and agree to appoint the homestay hosts as their agents in New Zealand to receive such information in substitution for the Parents.

- 7. The Parents agree to provide the School with academic, medical or other information relating to the well-being of the Student as may be requested from time to time by the School.
- 8. The School shall use its best endeavours to ensure the safety, health and well-being of the Student but shall not be liable for:
 - 8.1 Any damage or harm caused to the Student or the Student's property arising out of the Student's homestay;
 - 8.2 Any damage or harm caused to the Student or the Student's property outside of normal school hours and in the case of the student's property, shall not be responsible for any damage to such property that may occur outside the School's premises.
- 9. Without restricting clause 7, but subject to clause 9, the School's liability in relation to the supply of services to the Student is limited to the amount of fees paid by the Student for the provision of the services in respect of which liability arises.
- 10. Nothing in this Agreement limits any rights the Parents and/or Student may have under the Consumer Guarantees Act 1993.
- 11. Either party may terminate this agreement at any time upon written notice. If the agreement is terminated the Refund Policy for international students shall apply.
- 12. It is acknowledged that the suspension, expulsion and exclusion of students provisions as set out in Part 11 of the Education Act 1989 shall apply to the Student in New Zealand. Any decision under these provisions to expel or suspend the Student for a specified period shall terminate this agreement and the refunds policy shall apply. The Parents shall have no claim in damages or for any compensation if this agreement is terminated in these circumstances.
- 13. Neither party shall be in default or in breach of their obligations under this agreement to the extent that the performance of these obligations is prevented by an event of force majeure. Force majeure means an event beyond the reasonable control of the party seeking to rely on force majeure.
- 14. This agreement shall be construed to take effect in accordance with the domestic laws of New Zealand. In relation to any legal action or proceedings arising out of or in connection with this agreement the Parents irrevocably submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of New Zealand, agree that proceedings may be brought before any court including any forum constituted under the Arbitration act 1908 within New Zealand and waive any objection to proceedings in any such court or forum on the grounds of venue or on the grounds that the proceedings have been brought in an inconvenient forum.
- 15. The Parents agree that the Student will comply with school rules and policies including the Student Code of Conduct.
- 16. Applications for homestay made on behalf of the student shall be subject to the undertakings and agreements set out in the Homestay Agreement and in the Homestay Provider Agreement.

- 17. Students are required to return to their home country the day after their final examination at the end of the school year, or the day after school finishes, whichever applies to the student's year level, or at the discretion of the Director of International Students.
- 18. Notices given under this agreement must be in writing and given to the addresses set out in the application forms. Those sent by post shall be deemed to have been received five days after posting.
- 19. This agreement shall consist of the Application Form and Student Profile, and this Tuition Agreement including the attached Refund Policy, Student Code of Conduct and Homestay Agreement. This agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties and overrides any prior promises, representations, understandings or agreements. The terms of the agreement may be changed by the School in writing to the Parents and shall continue in force while the Student is enrolled with the School.
- 20. The Parents acknowledge that:
 - (a) Personal information of the Parents and/or Student collected or held by the School is provided and may be held, used and disclosed to enable the School to process the application for tuition, provide tuition and homestay services to the Student, provide to the Student and/or Parents advice or information concerning products and services the School believes may be of interest to the Student and/or Parents and to enable the School to communicate with the Student and/or Parents for any purpose;
 - (b) All personal information provided to the School is collected and will be held by the School at 930 Cameron Road, Tauranga 3112, New Zealand, phone number (64 7) 578-8114; fax number (64 7) 578-8447;
 - (c) If the Student/Parents fail to provide any information requested in the application for tuition, the School may be unable to process the application;
 - (d) The Student/Parents have the right under the Privacy Act 1993 to obtain access to and request corrections of any personal information held by the School concerning them.
- 21. The Student/Parents authorise the School to obtain at any time from any person or entity any information it requires to process and/or accept the application for tuition or to perform or complete any of the other purposes under this Agreement. The Student/Parents authorise any such person to release to the School any personal information that person holds concerning the Student/Parents.

5: Terms and Conditions

If Tauranga Girls' College accepts the student named in the previous sections, the following terms and conditions shall apply:

1. The School shall

- Provide tuition in accordance with the New Zealand Ministry of Education Code of Practice for the recruitment, welfare and support of foreign fee paying students.
- Arrange appropriate homestay accommodation for the student...
- Advise the student's homestay hosts of all matters and information required to be provided to parents of any student under the Education Act 1989.
- Provide academic progress reports regularly throughout the year. A copy will be sent to the parent(s), agent and homestay host.
- Collect, hold and use any personal information for school purposes.

2. The parents or guardians shall:

- Agree that the student will comply with the college rules and regulations.
- Agree that the student will attend school regularly.
- Agree to the refund policy as set by the Board of Trustees.
- Not request extended student leave from the college which will interrupt the student's academic progress.
- Accept the requirements of homestay accommodation.
- Allow the college to arrange the necessary insurance cover for travel, personal effects and medical.

3. The student shall:

- Comply with the school rules and regulations.
- Attend school on a regular basis and produce a written note or medical certificate to explain any absences on the day of student returning to school.
- Wear correct school uniform.
- Not request extended holiday leave or leave outside the academic school year unless in exceptional circumstances. This will be considered at the discretion of the Director of International Students.
- Comply with the rules and requirements of the homestay.

Acceptance of Enrolment Terms and Conditions

Before your application can be considered please sign the following acknowledgements (to be signed by a parent or guardian of a student under the age of 20 years):

- 1. You guarantee the good behaviour of the student in New Zealand.
- 2. You accept that the student will comply with the school rules and regulations.
- 3. You accept the right of the school to effect a change of course if this is seen to be in the best interests of the student.
- 4. You have read, understood and signed the Tuition Agreement which shall apply if your application is successful.
- 5. You have disclosed any information which may affect the student's ability to study effectively while in New Zealand.
- 6. You have disclosed all medical information which may have an impact on the student's stay in New Zealand.
- 7. You accept that the student will attend school regularly and in the case of irregular attendance the school shall contact the parent(s) or agent and the Immigration Service.
- 8. You guarantee not to request extended student leave from the school which will interrupt the academic progress of the student unless there are exceptional circumstances. This will be considered at the discretion of the Director of International students.
- 9. You allow the school to arrange the necessary travel, personal effects and medical insurance.
- 10. You guarantee the student will comply with the rules and requirements of the homestay.

Should your application be successful, you will receive a letter to confirm offer of a place. However, you will need to pay the year's fees before a visa will be granted. If you accept the offer of a place then this Application Form and Student Profile and the attached Tuition Agreement shall be the terms and conditions of agreement by which tuition shall be provided to the student. If the terms are signed by a parent or guardian and the student is under the age of 20 years then the parent or guardian shall be bound by these terms and conditions.
