


Student Welfare

Guidance and Careers teachers Requirements provide information on careers, courses and subject choice. The careers teacher assists students with applications to universities.




Students are buddied with 'kiwi' students in their form class. As well there is a co-ordinator at each form level. Students meet in form classes with a form teacher each day.


